Culverts were replaced on Lembcke and Island Roads, including some ditch work.

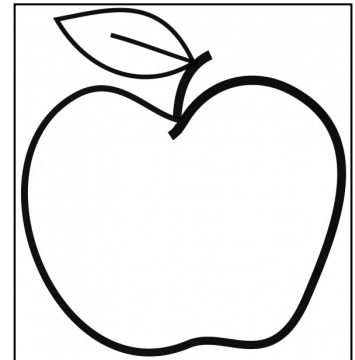

Please be watchful of the mowers.

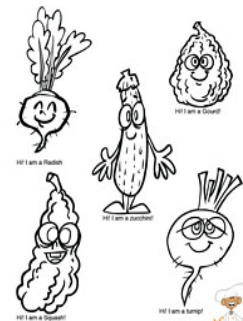

Notes from the Dunham Township Assessor's Desk

The 2019 Quadrennial Year

As I sit in my office working on the 2019 "Book," I have noticed that some Residential parcel assessments are changing.

Some will go down in their assessments. This is a good thing, it means the assessment in 2018 was too high.

Some will stay the

same because the 2018 assessment was as it should be.

Some will go up because their 2018 assessment was too low.

As there was no specific area this happened in, there is no way to tell which subdivision or parcels are effected. However, in



September 2019 the NOTICE OF ASSESSMENTS will come out and then you will know which category your parcel falls in. Until then, residential parcel owners will need to wait for more information.



Three Year Sales Ratio

This term is used when explaining how assessments change. A THREE YEAR SALES RATIO is determined for each township and for the county and it is based on the total sales for the past three years.

This year, assessors are using 2018, 2017 and

2016 sales to determine the Sales Ratio. Sales have been showing the market value of residential homes are going up.

Assessors use a PROCESS for assessing called MASS APPRAISAL. By using this process that includes the

Three Year Sales Ratio and then use specific formulas designed for this task.

MCHENRY COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

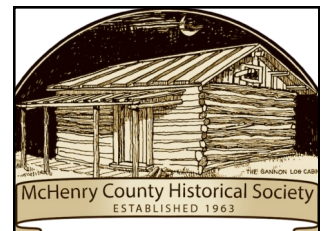

SALSA CHICKEN

Salsa Chicken in the Slow Cooker

4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts

2 tbsp. taco seasoning

3 cups of salsa

Place chicken breasts in slow cooker. Stir together the salsa and taco seasoning. Pour over chicken.

Cook 3.5 to 4 hours on high or 6-8 hours on low. You may want to check for

doneness earlier than said. When done, the chicken will shred easily.

The chicken could be placed on brown rice or into tortillas. Add your favorite taco toppings, if desired.

Also the salsa and taco seasoning could be salt free or low sodium if so inclined.
