Back in the day, a person could find out a lot more

about local hospitals. And that is a good thing. After all,

it's not like you are going in for an oil change.

Harvard Hospital, the county's first, was the last in the area to go private. Begun in 1898 by Dr. Horace W. Johnson, Cottage Hospital began in humble surroundings - a small, brick building at Front Street and Route 14. In 1997, Harvard Memorial Hospital (now Mercyhealth Hospital and Medical Center) made the decision to go private after 41 years a public hospital. And when the estimated \$90,000 in tax dollars went away, so did the unique public access into its business side.

Last year's "Ghost Town" bus tour of McHenry County communities that didn't quite make a go of it was so popular, we're going to do it again! Narrator/historian Craig Pfannkuche will once again lead the revial, seeing the remants of such unincporated crossings as Ridgefield, Barreville, Ostend and Solon MIlls.

Salt orders were made for the winter and will come in as needed.

The installation of speed limits signs have been installed on Island Road. This was needed to slow drivers down on several of the hills on that road.

Tree trimming was completed this fall which helps when ice is on the tree branches. Heavy ice on the tree branches can cause them to fall on the road blocking traffic.

Last fall LED lights were installed on Township Stop signs and several caution signs.

Snow plowing and road ice removal has been on-going since October 31, 2019.

Replacing several Township culverts will happen this summer.

Notes from the Dunham Township Assessor's Desk

Senate Bill 1932 was signed into law in 2019. That bill created a Property Tax Relief Task Force. The report was due from that Task Force on December 31, 2019.

Not to any ones surprise, the report was not finalized. However, a draft was released by someone to the press. In it at least two things have been identified as indications of why Illinois Property taxes are so high.

Most property taxpayers are aware that the highest percentage on the tax bill is that of the public schools. Due to Illinois' failure to fund schools, which then forces burden on property owners. Second is the exemptions system; there are so many exemptions available it is causing a shrinking tax base.

Township Officials of Illinois keep Townships informed of any changes or House Bills and Senate Bills that will affect Tax Bills and Townships.

I am sure there are other internet articles on IRS requirements for hobby farming.

So this Spring, start work-

ing on your hobby farm and perform this for two years then ask again for a change in parcel assessment.
